

Returning to Work After Testing Positive for COVID-19

RETURN TO WORK

Stay at home for at least 10 days after symptoms 1st appeared AND 24 hours after fever stops AND symptoms are improving. If symptoms worsen, contact your Doctor.

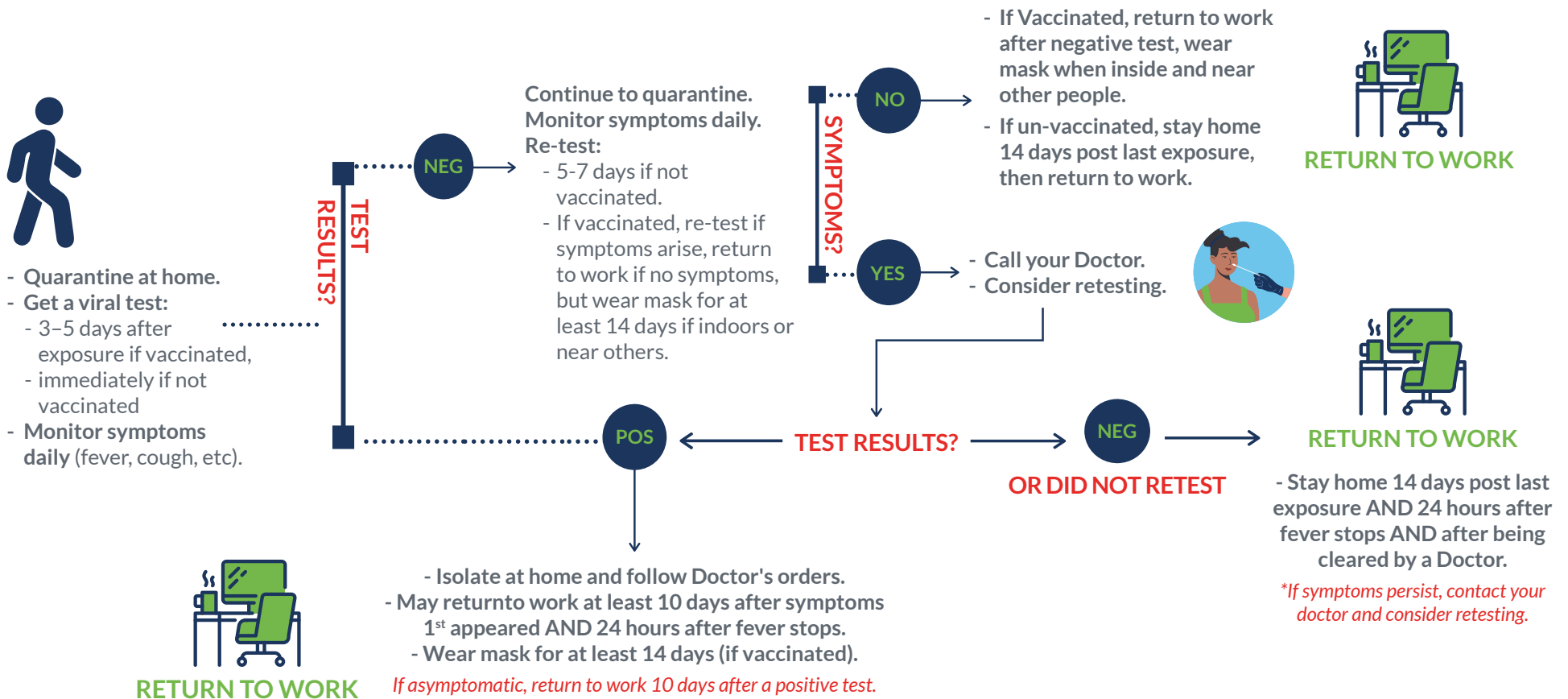
Asymptomatic persons who never develop symptoms may return to work 10 days after positive test.

Same rules apply whether vaccinated or not

A test-based strategy is NOT recommended to determine when to discontinue home isolation. Retesting is not recommended within the first 3 months after diagnosis, unless new COVID-19 symptoms develop without alternative diagnosis identified.

Please note that these recommendations do not apply to people with severe COVID-19 symptoms or with weakened immune systems (immunocompromised).

Returning to Work After Exposure to COVID-19



*People are considered fully vaccinated: 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as J&J vaccine.
